

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Terms and Conditions
(Unless otherwise specified)

1. **General:** When the State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee issues a purchase document in response to the Vendor's bid, a binding contract is created.
2. **Variation in Quantity:** No variation in the quantity of any item called for by this order will be accepted unless such variation has been caused by conditions of loading, shipping, packing or allowances in manufacturing process and then only to the extent, if any, specified in this order.
3. **Assignment:**
 - a. Neither the order, nor any interest therein, nor any claim thereunder, shall be assigned or transferred by the Vendor, except as set forth in Subparagraph 3b or as expressly authorized in writing by the State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee. No such assignment or transfer shall relieve the Vendor from the obligations and liabilities under this order.
 - b. Vendor agrees that any and all claims for overcharge resulting from antitrust violations which are borne by the State as to goods, services, and materials purchased in connection with this bid are hereby assigned to the State.
4. **State Furnished Property:** State furnished property shall be returned to the State upon request in the same condition as received except for ordinary wear, tear and modifications ordered hereunder.
5. **Discounts:** Prompt payment discounts will not be considered in computing the low bid. Discounts for payment within twenty (20) days will be considered after the award of the contract. Discounted time will be computed from the date of receipt of the merchandise invoice, whichever is later.
6. **Inspection:** Final inspection and acceptance will be made at the destination. Supplies rejected at the destination for nonconformance with specifications shall be removed at the Vendor's risk and expense, promptly after notice of rejection.
7. **Inspection of Plant:** The State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee may inspect, at any reasonable time, the part of the Contractor's, or any subcontractor's plant or place of business, which is related to the performance of this contract.
8. **Commercial Warranty:** The Vendor agrees that the supplies or services furnished under this order shall be covered by the most favorable commercial warranties the Vendor gives for such to any customer for such supplies or services. The rights and remedies provided herein shall extend to the State and are in addition to and do not limit any rights afforded to the State by any other clause of this order. **Vendor agrees not to disclaim warranties of fitness for a particular purpose of merchantability.**
9. **Taxes:** The unit price shall exclude all state taxes.
10. **Packing, Shipping and Invoicing:**
 - a. The State's purchasing document number and the Vendor's name, user's name and location shall be shown on each packing and delivery ticket, package, bill of lading and other correspondence in connection with the shipments. The user's count will be accepted by the Vendor as final and conclusive on all shipments not accompanied by a packing ticket.
 - b. The Vendor's invoice shall be submitted duly certified and shall contain the following information: order number, description of supplies or services, quantities, unit price and extended totals. Separate invoices shall be rendered for each and every complete shipment.
 - c. Invoices must be submitted to the using agency and NOT the State Purchasing Agent.
11. **Default:** The State reserves the right to cancel all or any part of this order without cost to the State, if the Vendor fails to meet the provisions of this order and, except as otherwise provided herein, to hold the Vendor liable for any excess cost occasioned by the State due to the Vendor's default. The Vendor shall not be liable for any excess costs if failure to perform the order arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Vendor, such causes include but are not restricted to, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the State or Federal Government,

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fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather and defaults of subcontractors due to any of the above, unless the State shall determine that the supplies or services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Vendor to meet the required delivery scheduled. The rights of the State provided in this paragraph shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights now being provided by law or under this order.

12. **Non-Collusion:** In signing this bid the Vendor certifies he/she has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with this offer submitted to the State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee.

13. **Nondiscrimination:** Vendor doing business with the State of New Mexico must be in compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title VII of the Act (Rev. 1979) and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336).

14. **The Procurement Code:** Sections 13-1-28 through 13-1-199 NMSA 1978, imposes civil and criminal penalties for its violation. In addition the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.

15. **Items:** All bid items are to be NEW and of most current production, unless otherwise specified.

16. **Payment for Purchases:** Except as otherwise agreed to: late payment charges may be assessed against the user state agency in the amount and under the conditions set forth in Section 13-1-158 NMSA 1978.

17. **Workers' Compensation:** The Contractor agrees to comply with state laws and rules pertaining to Workers' Compensation benefits for its employees. If the Contractor fails to comply with Workers' Compensation Act and applicable rules when required to do so, this Agreement may be terminated by the contracting agency.

18. **Submission of Bid:** Bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the bid number and opening date clearly indicated on the bottom left hand side of the front of the envelope. Failure to label bid envelope will necessitate the premature opening of the bid in order to identify the bid number.

19. **Contractor Personnel:** Personnel proposed in the Contractor's written bid to the Procuring Agency are considered material to any work performed under this Price Agreement. Once a Purchase Order or contract has been executed, no changes of personnel will be made by the Contractor without prior written consent of the Procuring Agency. Replacement of any Contractor personnel, if approved, shall be with personnel of equal ability, experience, and qualifications. The Contractor will be responsible for any expenses incurred in familiarizing the replacement personnel to insure their being productive to the project immediately upon receiving assignments. Approval of replacement personnel shall not be unreasonably withheld. The Procuring Agency shall retain the right to request the removal of any of the Contractor's personnel at any time.

20. **Subcontracting:** The Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the Price Agreement without the prior written approval of the Procuring Agency. No such subcontracting shall relieve the Contractor from its obligations and liabilities under this Price Agreement, nor shall any subcontracting obligate payment from the Agency.

21. **Records and Audit:** The Contractor shall maintain detailed time and expenditure records that indicate the date, time, nature, and cost of services rendered during this Price Agreement's term and effect, and retain them for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Price Agreement. The records shall be subject to inspection by the Agency, State Purchasing Division, Department of Finance and Administration, and for Information Technology contracts, State Chief Information Officer. The Agency shall have the right to audit billings, both before and after payment. Payment for services under this Price Agreement shall not foreclose the right of the Agency to recover excessive or illegal payments.

22. **Subcontracts:** The foregoing requirements for Contractor Personnel, Subcontracting, and Audit shall be inserted into all subcontracts from the prime contractor to the subcontractor.

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New Mexico Employees Health Coverage

A. If Contractor has, or grows to, six (6) or more employees who work, or who are expected to work, an average of at least 20 hours per week over a six (6) month period during the term of the contract, Contractor certifies, by signing this agreement, to have in place, and agrees to maintain for the term of the contract, health insurance for its New Mexico Employees and offer that health insurance to its New Mexico Employees if the expected annual value in the aggregate of any and all contracts between Contractor and the State exceeds \$250,000 dollars.

B. Contractor agrees to maintain a record of the number of its New Mexico Employees who have (a) accepted health insurance; (b) declined health insurance due to other health insurance coverage already in place; or (c) declined health insurance for other reasons. These records are subject to review and audit by a representative of the state.

C. Contractor agrees to advise all of its New Mexico Employees of the availability of State publicly financed health care coverage programs by providing each of its New Mexico Employees with, as a minimum, the following web site link to additional information: <http://www.insurenemexico.state.nm.us/>.

D. For purposes of this Paragraph, the following terms have the following meanings:

- (1) "New Mexico Employee" means any resident of the State of New Mexico employed by Contractor who performs the majority of the employee's work for Contractor within the State of New Mexico, regardless of the location of Contractor's office or offices; and
- (2) "offer" means to make available, without unreasonable restriction, enrollment in one or more health coverage plans and to actively seek and encourage participation in order to achieve the goals of Executive Order 2007-049. This could include State publicly financed public health coverage programs such as *Insure New Mexico!*

New Mexico Pay Equity Initiative

Contractor agrees, if it has ten (10) or more New Mexico employees OR eight (8) or more employees in the same job classification, at any time during the term of this contract, to complete and submit the PE10-249 form on the annual anniversary of the initial report submittal for contracts up to one (1) year in duration. If contractor has (250) or more employees, contractor must complete and submit the PE250 form on the annual anniversary of the initial report submittal for contracts that are up to one (1) year in duration. For contracts that extend beyond one (1) calendar year, or are extended beyond one (1) calendar year, contractor also agrees to complete and submit the PE10-249 or PE250 form, whichever is applicable, within thirty (30) days of the annual contract anniversary date of the initial submittal date or, if more than 180 days has elapsed since submittal of the last report, at the completion of the contract, whichever comes first. Should contractor not meet the size requirement for reporting at contract award but subsequently grows such that they meet or exceed the size requirement for reporting, contractor agrees to provide the required report within ninety (90) days of meeting or exceeding the size requirement. That submittal date shall serve as the basis for submittals required thereafter.

Contractor also agrees to levy this requirement on any subcontractor(s) performing more than 10% of the dollar value of this contract if said subcontractor(s) meets, or grows to meet, the stated employee size thresholds during the term of the contract. Contractor further agrees that, should one or more subcontractor not meet the size requirement for reporting at contract award but subsequently grows such that they meet or exceed the size requirement for reporting, contractor will submit the required report, for each such subcontractor, within ninety (90) days of that subcontractor meeting or exceeding the size requirement. Subsequent report submittals, on behalf of each such subcontractor, shall be due on the annual anniversary of the initial report submittal. Contractor shall submit the required form(s) to the State Purchasing Division of the General Services Department, and other departments as may be determined, on behalf of the applicable subcontractor(s) in accordance with the schedule contained in this paragraph. Contractor acknowledges that this subcontractor requirement applies even though contractor itself may not meet the size requirement for reporting and be required to report it self.

Two (2) copies of the Pay Equity Worksheet shall be submitted prior to Award by the prospective Awarded Vendor.

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Department Price Agreement

Article I – Statement of Work

Under the terms and conditions of this Price Agreement, the using agency may issue orders for items and/or services described herein.

The terms and conditions of this Price Agreement shall form a part of each order issued hereunder.

The items and/or services to be ordered shall be listed under Article IX – Price Schedule. All orders issued hereunder will bear both an order number and this Price Agreement number. It is understood that no guarantee or warranty is made or implied by either the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent or the user that any order for any definite quantity will be issued under this Price Agreement. The Contractor is required to accept the order and furnish the items and/or services in accordance with the articles contained hereunder for the quantity of each order issued.

Article II – Term

The term of this Price Agreement for issuance of orders shall be as indicated in specifications.

Article III – Specifications

Items and/or services furnished hereunder shall conform to the requirements of specifications and/or drawings applicable to items listed under Article IX - Price Schedule. Orders issued against this schedule will show the applicable price agreement item(s), number(s), and price(s); however they may not describe the item(s) fully.

Article IV – Shipping and Billing Instructions

Contractor shall ship in accordance with the instructions of this form. Shipment shall be made only against specific orders which the user may place with the contractor during the term indicated in Article II – Term. The Contractor shall enclose a packing list with each shipment listing the order number, price agreement number and the commercial parts number (if any) for each item. Delivery shall be made as indicated on page 1. If vendor is unable to meet stated delivery the State Purchasing Agent must be notified.

Article V - Termination

The Agency may terminate this Agreement for convenience or cause. The Contractor may only terminate this Agreement based upon the Agency's uncured, material breach of this Agreement. Contractor shall give Agency written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination, which notice shall (i) identify all the Agency's material breaches of this Agreement upon which the termination is based and (ii) state what the Agency must do to cure such material breaches. Contractor's notice of termination shall only be effective (i) if the Agency does not cure all material breaches within the thirty (30) day notice period or (ii) in the case of material breaches that cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, the Agency does not, within the thirty (30) day notice period, notify the Contractor of its intent to cure and begin with due diligence to cure the material breach. Termination of this Contract, however, shall not affect any outstanding orders. This provision is not exclusive and shall not waive other rights and remedies afforded either party in the event of breach of contract or default. In such instances the contract may be cancelled effective immediately.

Article VI – Amendment

This Price Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee and the Contractor upon written notice by either party to the other. An amendment to this Price Agreement shall not affect any outstanding orders issued prior to the effective date of the amendment as mutually agreed upon, and as published by the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent or his/her designee. Amendments affecting price adjustments and/or the extension of a price agreement expiration date are not allowed unless specifically provided for in the bid and price agreement specifications.

Article VII – Issuance of Orders

Only written signed orders are valid under this Price Agreement.

Article VIII – Packing (if applicable)

Packing shall be in conformance with standard commercial practices.

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Specifications:

To establish a Price Agreement for Electrical Services and Repairs "On Call" for the New Mexico Department of Transportation in District 5.

The term of this Price Agreement shall be for one (1) year from date of award with the option to extend for a period of three (3) additional years, on a year-to-year basis, by mutual agreement of all parties and approval of the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent at the same price, terms and conditions. This Price Agreement shall not exceed four (4) years.

These services will be provided at the New Mexico Department of Transportation District Five Headquarters, Construction Project Offices, Maintenance Patrol Yards and Rest Areas.

The offices listed above are located in Santa Fe, Los Alamos, San Juan, Torrance, Taos and Rio Arriba Counties.

Electrical Service/Repairs to include but not limited to:

- Installation of panel boxes, conduits, cables/wires and underground conduit.
- Repair/Replace electrical equipment; i.e. lighting systems outlets, switches.
- General industrial electrical repairs and installations.
- Pump controls (water & fuel).

Awarded Contractor(s) will be required to assist Department personnel in locating and diagnosing electrical problems.

Contractor shall respond within twenty-four (24) hours for normal service and three (3) hours for emergency service to all calls relative to service and/or repairs to all units, administration buildings, patrol buildings, or other electrical problems within District 5.

All work shall be performed during normal working hours (7:45 am - 4:30 pm Monday-Friday) unless otherwise approved by the Department Supervisor. Coordinate with owner in advance, areas to be dedicated to contractor's operations, lay-down and storage of materials/equipment. Notify owner forty-eight (48) hours in advance of any interruption of utilities, access and/or usage of the facility. Minimize duration of any interruption.

Awarded Contractor(s) will coordinate use of utilities with the Department prior to initiating any work at the site. The Department will determine the time and place for use of any utilities requested by the awarded Contractor(s).

Hold Harmless Clause:

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers, and employees, against liability, claims, damages, losses, or expenses arising out of bodily injury to persons or damage to properties caused by, or resulting from, Contractor's and/or its employees, own negligent acts or omissions while Contractor, and/or its employees perform or fail to perform its obligations and duties under the terms and conditions of this Price Agreement. This Save Harmless and Indemnification Clause is subject to the immunities, provisions, and limitations of the Tort Claims Act (Section 41-4-1, et seq., NMSA 1978 Comp. and Section 56-7-1 NMSA 1978 Comp.) and any amendments thereto. It is specifically agreed between the parties executing this Price Agreement that it is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of the Price Agreement to create the public or any member hereof a third party beneficiary or to authorize anyone not a party to the Price Agreement to maintain a suit for wrongful death, bodily and/or personal injury to persons, damage to properties and/or other claims whatsoever pursuant to the provisions of this Price Agreement.

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Bonding:

13-4-18, NMSA 1978, requires performance and payment bonds as follows:

For any job order estimate awarded in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), the following bonds or security shall be delivered to the state agency or local public body, before work shall commence, and shall become binding on the parties upon the execution of this Price Agreement. If a contractor fails to deliver the required performance and payment bonds, the Contractor's job order estimate shall be rejected. Award of the agreement shall be made pursuant to the procurement code in the following manner.

1. A Performance bond satisfactory to the State Agency of Local public body, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state and surety to be approved in Federal Circular 570 as published by the United State Treasury Department or the State Board of Finance or the Local governing authority, in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the price specified in the Price Agreement; and
2. A payment bond satisfactory to the state agency of local public body, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state and said surety to be approved in Federal Circular 570 as published by the United States Treasury Department or the State Board of Finance or the local governing authority, in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the price specified in the contract, for the protection of all persons supplying labor and material to the Contractor or its subcontractors for the performance of the work provided for in the contract.

For purposes of this Price Agreement, the Contractor shall provide, to the State agency contracting for services, a fully executed performance bond and payment bond for the amount of work to be performed as defined in part four: job order execution.

The costs for provision of bonds shall be included in the work order cost estimate. No separate provision shall be made for expenses due to bonds.

Public Works Minimum Wage Act:

This is a Public Works contract subject to the provisions of the Public Works Minimum Wage Act, Section 13-4-11 through 13-4-17, et seq. NMSA 1978 as amended. Minimum Wage Rates as determined and published by the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions, Public Works Bureau, Santa Fe, New Mexico, shall be in effect and utilized by the vendor during the life of this price agreement.

You are hereby advised that wherever differences exist between the minimum wage rates shown under wage decisions of the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions, Public Works Bureau, Santa Fe, New Mexico, and those shown under U.S. Department of Labor Wage Decision and any modification thereto noted in the contract assembly, the higher wage rates shall govern.

If a Contractor or subcontractor is willfully paying his laborers, mechanics, or operators less than the rates required by the agreement for the work the laborers, mechanics, and operators are performing, the contractor or subcontractor may lose his right to proceed with the work.

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Awarded Contractor(s) agree(s) to:

- A. Furnish all equipment, labor, materials & tools required to perform the work specified.
- B. Be responsible for all cleanup of materials at the job site resulting from the performance of any work.
- C. Provide competent supervision and skilled personnel to carry on all work in progress.
- D. Comply with all applicable codes and regulations pertaining to work performed and materials used.
- E. Provide all safeguards, safety devices and protective equipment, and take any other needed actions necessary to protect the life and health of employees on-the-job, the safety of the public, and to protect state property in connection with the performance of the work covered by the Price Agreement.
- F. Limit use of the premises to the work indicated. Confine operations at the site to the areas permitted. Portions of the site beyond areas on which work is indicated are not to be disturbed.
- G. Be responsible for loading/unloading all materials required to perform the work in this Price Agreement. Awarded contractor(s) will schedule deliveries to minimize long-term storage at the project area.

The Department reserves the right to purchase materials directly from State Price Agreements and to provide these materials to the awarded contractor.

Upon the default of the awarded contractor, the Department may undertake to complete the work with its own forces, or may procure a completing contractor to finish the work. All costs and charges thereby incurred by the Department, together with the cost of completing the work under contract, will be deducted from funds which are due or may become due the defaulting contractor.

Awarded contractor(s) agree(s) to provide services in accordance with instructions on this form and only against specific orders, which the Department may place with the awarded contract during the term of this Price Agreement. When applicable, all labor charges on the invoice will be broken down to indicate the number of hours consumed in performing specific tasks.

Awarded Contractor(s) shall have experience in all areas described and shall be a licensed and certified electrician within the State of New Mexico.

Contractor Note:

No person shall act as a contractor without a license issued by the Construction Industries Division (CID) classified to cover the type of work to be undertaken. No bid on a contract shall be submitted unless the Contractor has a valid license issued by the Construction Industries Division (CID) to bid and perform the type of work to be undertaken, § 60-13-12, NMSA 1978.

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Method of Award:

The State of New Mexico reserves the right to award this agreement to multiple vendors. Bids for services are requested on a districtwide basis. The intent of this Price Agreement is to issue awards to companies who may best be able to perform the work in an effective, efficient manner. Multiple awards shall be based on the nearest vendor to the various locations specified below. Travel time will not be allowed as per hourly rate from vendor's place of business to work site. Hourly rate will begin at the job site. Determination of the hours paid will be based upon arrival at the job site and end upon leaving the job site.

The Department will require a total price quote prior to final approval of any order for service.

Response Time:

In the event that the awarded contractor(s) are unable to be located within a twenty-four (24) hour period to perform an electrical job, the Department reserves the right to call on another electrician to perform the needed job.

Tax Note:

Price shall not include state gross receipts tax or local option tax (es). Such tax or taxes shall be added at time of invoicing at current rate, and shown as a separate item to be paid by user.

The prices quoted herein represent the total compensation to be paid by the State for goods and/or services provided. It is understood that the party providing said goods and/or services to the State is responsible for payment of all cost of labor, equipment, tools, material, federal tax, permits, licenses, fees and any other items necessary to complete the work provided. The price quoted in this Price Agreement includes an amount sufficient to cover such costs.

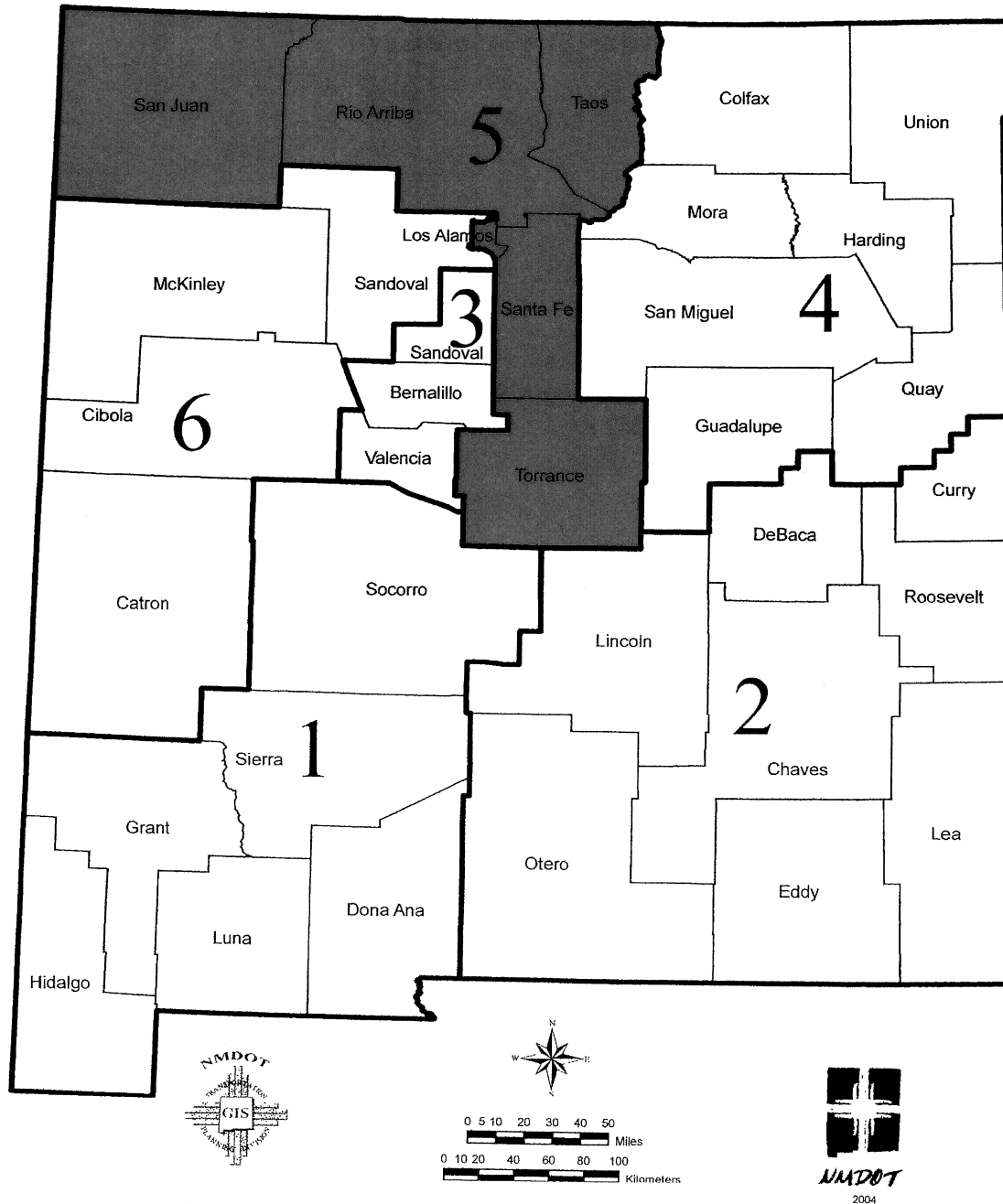
